

Sadly, Pat Fairhead, CSPWC Life Member passed away this summer. Pat's retrospective exhibition will be on at the Arts & Letters Club of Toronto until October 27th. Newer members might not know this, but there was a long tradition of an evening "President's Reception" gathering at the end of the CSPWC AGM. My first memory of Pat was attending such an event at her converted industrial studio / loft apartment in the Dundas West area of Toronto. What a reveal - when the doors opened from the elevator -directly into her flat! It was quite an impression.

I attended the curatorial talk about Ann MacIntosh Duff's survey exhibition at the McMichael Canadian Art Collection. After the initial viewing of her summer work from her Georgian Bay Cottage, they have exchanged out the work for her urban Toronto / winter scenes. As her exhibition has been extended into early March 2024, there is still plenty of time to go and see it if you can. ArtBus dates have been added to facilitate those who do not have a direct way to travel.

With the passing of Pat (Member 1968) and Ann (Member 1952, Honorary Member 1985), Michael Cleary (Member, 1977), Peggy Squire (Member 1980) and Ray Cattell (Member 1965) – the CSPWC has seen the end of an era. I loved discovering the neighbourhood of Cathedral Village where I spent a few pre-symposium days figuring out the best painting spots, and a few days painting along with a truly great group of painters. It really was a pleasure to meet everyone at the symposium, and although it ended up raining on the day we were supposed to get outside the city, I was able to take a short drive out to Wascana Trails to see the prairie landscapes and the vast fields of canola in bloom. What a sight! I hope to get back there to paint those vistas another time. A big thanks to Tom Young and all the volunteers and sponsors who made this such a great event. It was a huge event to organize but everyone had such a wonderful time!




Cathedral Lane, 14" x 10"

It was my first time in Regina so I arrived a few days early to check out my workshop location in Cathedral Village. It's a vibrant neighbourhood near the downtown core, and the main streets are lined with small shops and restaurants, and lots of great views down lanes and alleys. This is one I painted the day before the symposium started.

We spent two days exploring different viewpoints along 13th Avenue, and on our second day we focused on sketching an interesting row of 1912 houses, each painted a different colour. I loved the repeating triangles of the gabled roofs, and I was particularly happy to be able to include a pedestrian wearing a Roughriders shirt, since it seems that there are some serious football fans in Saskatchewan.

It makes me SO happy to have this souvenir of that beautiful landscape.

The Canadian Society of Painters in Water Colour's 98th Annual Open Water / L'Eau Claire Exhibition 2023 An International Juried Exhibition of Water Based Media



This year, we eagerly resumed our live Open Water art exhibit at the Neilson Park Creative Centre, located at 56 Neilson Dr., Toronto. It is truly a wonderful venue. The Art Space Connect (Main) Gallery, with its spacious layout and lofty ceilings, provided a perfect backdrop for the exhibition. The showcase spanned close to three weeks, running from September 5 to September 24, 2023. The first and last days were designated for drop-off and pick-up.

The jury panel for the Open Water exhibit was composed of three Jurors: two CSPWC members and one guest juror. Serving as our Guest Juror was Suzanne Carte MA BFA, a distinguished curator and cultural producer based in Toronto, Canada. Suzanne currently holds the esteemed position of Senior Curator at the Art Gallery of Burlington. Alongside Suzanne, we were privileged to have two respected CSPWC jurors, Mark Rosser (CSPWC TWSA) and Carol Westcott (BA MPA CSPWC OSA SCA), who brought their invaluable expertise to the judging process. Their collective discernment added a rich layer of insight to the selection of artworks.



What about the Process? What went on behind the scenes?

We used ArtCall, an online management and entry submission software designed for artists to submit their artwork along with payments. This platform was effective in managing the submission process. The Chair organized a digital presentation for the Jurors, which was conducted live at the CSPWC office. Through three rounds of the jury process, the final selection of 42 paintings was made.

Artworks were either personally delivered to the gallery at designated times or shipped to the CSPWC office for non-local artists. Subsequently, they were handled with care during transportation and unpacked upon arrival. Following the conclusion of the exhibit, artworks were either picked up or securely packed for shipping back to the artists, and then transported back to the CSPWC office.

As this poem beautifully captures:


"The world was once again their stage, The music played, the rhythm divine, Their hearts filled with joy.... And so they danced, and so they sang,

Remembering Pat Fairhead Cover Photo: CSPWC/SCPA Diploma Collection

"My idea of heaven is to sit on the tundra, watercolours spread around me, sun on my back and paint. - Pat Fairhead



These words from her retrospective at the 2022 CSPWC AGM, and her friend and companion Wendie Donabie.

Courageous, daring, passionate, outspoken, independent, single-minded, determined, focused, no-nonsense when it came to art; she loved beer, a good gin martin. She was a painter and would not refer to herself as an artist, an adventurer, a pioneer, a teacher and mentor, a mother, a friend. To her close friends and grandchildren, she was Bubbles.



Pat attended Forest Hill Public School for Juniors and Seniors. The school was testing a new curriculum that included 1½ hour art classes on Tuesday and Thursday mornings. These were called Opportunity Classes – certainly an understatement in Pat's case. She excelled achieving 95-100% in art. However, she did not fare as well with her other subjects. At every opportunity, she would skip class and escape to the art room. Eventually her art teacher, H.P. Gauthier, helped Pat pull together a portfolio of work, was interviewed by Fred Haines*, the principal at the Ontario College of Art and was accepted on the spot. Pat had to wait until her 16th birthday to begin her studies. Two days after that birthday, she was in class.



During her years at OCA, her strongest influence was group of seven artist, Frank Carmichael, who was Department Head of COMMERCIAL AND GRAPHIC ART. He taught drawing, watercolour and design. His classes were challenging but Pat loved them. She worked hard in class and at home, totally engrossed in learning and won herself a Proficiency prize. To her amazement, Franklin Carmichael pulled her aside to let her know how well she was doing.

Pat's sense of adventure inspired much of her work. In 1976, she began travelling extensively. Often in a 17ft canoe, she spent time from Haida Gwai, and Desolation Sound, Georgian Bay, as well as, the entire French River. She made her way to the coast to Newfoundland, and she traveled to the Arctic 9 tilmes, and these excursions were only Canada. She travelled to Botswana, Nimibia, Crete, France, England the Scottish Isles. She also painted in the Upper Amazon and Machu Picctu.



Her last solo show in October '22 at the age of 95 was 'Waterlines' based on the landscape of Helve Lake in the Limberlost Forest Reserve in Muskoka.



Pat accomplished so much in her lifetime, as an artist and a teacher. Her paintings are held in over 60 corporate and many private collections in North America. And in public collections including Queen's Park Parliament Buildings in Toronto, Ontario House in England and the Royal Collection of Drawings and Watercolours at Windsor Castle.

As well, during her life, Pat held over 70 solo shows and participated in over 65 group exhibitions in galleries across Canada, into the United States, England, and Scotland. In October 2022, Britton Gallery in Bracebridge hosted 'Waterlines'.

The Canadian Society of Painters in Water Colour acknowledged Pat's mastery of the medium with the presentation of three awards. In 2009 - The Heinz Jordan Award, in 2010 - D.L. Stevenson & Son Ltd. Award and in 2011, The A. J. Casson award medal for excellence in watercolour.



Posted across social media, each watercolour had Latin and English titles to reflect the often indecipherable language of medicine. Subjects included fatigue, headache, insomnia, pain flares, support, trauma, and more.

Sandra Woods...

was profiled in OT Now magazine, published by the Canadian Association of Occupational Therapists (CAOT), for using her artwork to raise awareness of chronic pain and to share the benefits of the arts for pain management.




